Application of the *Education and Care Services National Law (South Australia)* to residual early childhood services—

## s17—Exemption from certain provisions of *Education and Care Services National Law (South Australia)*

- (1) Subject to this section, the Minister may, by notice in writing—
- (a) exempt a person, or class of persons, subject to such conditions as the Minister thinks fit and specifies in the notice, from specified provisions of the *Education and Care Services National Law (South Australia)* as they apply to, or in relation to, residual early childhood services; or
- (b) vary or revoke an exemption, or a condition of an exemption, under this section or impose a further condition. (2)The Minister must consult with the Board before making a notice under subsection (1).
- (3) A person who contravenes a condition of an exemption is guilty of an offence. Maximum penalty: \$10 000.

#### s20—Power of delegation

(1) The Minister may delegate a function or power under this Act (other than a prescribed function or power) to a specified body or person (including a person for the time being holding or acting in a specified office or position)

110 Ventilation and natural light	The approved provider of an education and care service must ensure that the indoor spaces used by children at the education and care service premises—  (a) are well ventilated; and  (b) have adequate natural light; and  (c) are maintained at a temperature that ensures the safety and wellbeing of children.					
111 Administrative space	The approved provider of a centre-based service must ensure that an adequate area or areas are available at the education and care service premises for the purposes of— (a) conducting the administrative functions of the service; and (b) consulting with parents of children; and (c) conducting private conversations.

	(4) The approved provider of the service must ensure that nappy change facilities are designed, located and maintained in a way that prevents unsupervised access by children.	
115 Premises designed to facilitate supervision	The approved provider of a centre-based service must ensure that the education and care service premises (including toilets and nappy change facilities) are designed and maintained in a way that facilitates supervision of children at all times that they are being educated and cared for by the service, having regard to the need to maintain the rights and dignity of the children.	
108 Outdoor Space	(1) The approved provider of an education and care service must ensure that, for each child being educated and cared for by the service, the education and care service premises has at least 7 square metres of unencumbered outdoor space.	
	<ul> <li>(2) In calculating the area of unencumbered outdoor space required, the following areas are to be excluded—</li> <li>(a) any pathway or thoroughfare, except where used by children as part of the education and care program;</li> <li>(b) any car parking area;</li> <li>(c) any storage shed or other storage area;</li> <li>(d) any other space that is not suitable for children.</li> </ul>	
	(3) A verandah that is included in calculating the area of indoor space cannot be included in calculating the area of outdoor space.	
	<ul> <li>(4) An area of unencumbered indoor space may be included in calculating the outdoor space of a service that provides education and care to children over preschool age if—</li> <li>(a) the Regulatory Authority has given written approval; and</li> <li>(b) that indoor space has not been included in calculating the indoor space under regulation 107.</li> </ul>	
113 Outdoor space – natural environment	The approved provider of a centre-based service must ensure that the outdoor spaces provided at the education and care service premises allow children to explore and experience the natural environment.	
114 Outdoor space - shade	The approved provider of a centre-based service must ensure that outdoor spaces provided at the education and care service premises include adequate shaded areas to protect children from overexposure to ultraviolet radiation from the sun.

120 Supervision for educators under 18 years	The approved provider of a centre-based service must ensure that any educator at the service who is under 18 years of age—  (a) does not work alone at the service; and  (b) is adequately supervised at all times by an educator who has attained the age of 18 years.					
123 Educator-to- child ratios	<ul> <li>(1) The minimum number of educators required to educate and care for children at a centre- based service is to be calculated in accordance with the following ratios— <ul> <li>(a) for children from birth to 24 months of age—</li> <li>1 educator to 4 children;</li> <li>(b) for children over 24 months and less than</li> <li>36 months of age—1 educator to 5 children;</li> <li>(c) for children aged 36 months of age or over (not including children over preschool age)—</li> <li>1 educator to 10 children;</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

	<ul> <li>(2) A centre-based service is not required to comply with subregulation (1) if—</li> <li>(a) the approved number of places for children preschool age or under at a centre-based service is more than 80; and</li> <li>(b) the service employs or engages—</li> <li>(i) a full-time or full-time equivalent early childhood teacher at the service.</li> </ul>

136 First aid qualifications	(1) The approved provider of a centre-based service must ensure that the following persons are in attendance at any place where children are being educated and cared for by the service, and immediately available in an emergency, at all times that children are being educated and cared for by the service—  (a) at least one educator who holds a current approved first aid qualification; (b) at least one educator who has undertaken current approved anaphylaxis management training;  (c) at least one educator who has undertaken current approved emergency asthma management training.	
	(2) If children are being educated and cared for at service premises on the site of a school, it is sufficient for the purposes of subregulation (1) if the following are in attendance at the school site and immediately available in an emergency— (a) an educator referred to in subregulation (1)(a) or at least one staff member of the school who holds a current approved first aid qualification; (b) an educator referred to in subregulation (1)(b) or at least one staff member of the school who has undertaken current approved anaphylaxis management training; (c) an educator referred to in subregulation (1)(c) or at least one staff member of the school who has undertaken current approved emergency asthma management training.	
	(3) The same person may hold one or more of the qualifications set out in subregulation (1). (5) In this regulation—  approved anaphylaxis management training means anaphylaxis management training approved by the Board.	
	approved emergency asthma management training means emergency asthma management training approved by the Board.	
	approved first aid qualification means a qualification that—  (a) includes training in the following that relates to and is appropriate to children –  (i) emergency life support and cardio-pulmonary resuscitation; (ii) convulsions;  (iii) poisoning;  (iv) respiratory difficulties;  (v) management of severe bleeding; (vi) injury and basic wound care;  (vii) administration of an auto-immune adrenalin device.
